## NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY

The college will carry out NEP - 2020 as per the guidelines/directives of HP Govt and affiliating university and follow all the regulations of policy in toto including admission procedure from the date it is applicable.

NEP 2020 approved by Union Cabinet of India on 29th July 2020, outlines the vision of new education system of India. The policy aims to make education more inclusive, equitable and holistic and hence recommends a flexible curriculum that allows students to choose from a range of courses and subjects to meet their individual interests and career goal.

Under NEP 2020, the undergraduate degree will be of either 3 or 4-year duration, with multiple exit options within this period, with appropriate certifications will be given to students within their graduation tenure. **NO OF SEATS :100**

A total intake of 100 seats (Two basic units) including Medical/Non-Medical/Arts/Commerce streams has been approved by NCTE/HP Govt. and HPU Shimla for the session.

**ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA**

The candidates with at least 50% marks either in the Bachelor's degree (Medical/Non-Medical/Commerce/Arts) and or in the Masters degree in Science/Social Science/Humanities, Bachelor's in Engineering or Technology with specialization in Science and Mathematics with 55% marks or any other qualification equivalent and 45% marks in case of SC/ST/OBC/physically handicapped categories in the before said Bachelor/Master degree and 50% marks of Bachelor in Engineering or Technology from a recognized University established by law in India, are eligible for admission to the programme.

**MODE OF ADMISSION**

B Ed combined Entrance Test is conducted by the HPU Shimla to grant admission in the B Ed programme tentatively in May/June. After qualifying the test, online counselling takes place in three rounds tentatively in July/August by the concerned university for allotment of the institution as per the choice of the candidate.

**NOTE :** The Fee structure is finalized by Department of Education HP Govt & conveyed by HPU from time to time.

**The following will be the teaching subjects for the students of different streams:**

- a) B Com/ M Com students shall opt following teaching subjects:
  - 1. Teaching of one of the languages i.e. English /Hindi / Sanskrit
  - 2. Teaching of commerce
  
- b) B Sc (Medical) graduate shall opt the following two teaching subjects:
  - 1. Teaching of life sciences
  - 2. Teaching of physical sciences
  
- c) B Sc (Non-medical) graduates shall opt the following two teaching subjects:
  - 1. Teaching of Mathematics
  - 2. Teaching of physical sciences

OR

Teaching Mathematics :It shall be opted by the graduates who have taken mathematics as one of the subjects at their graduation level.

Teaching of any of the languages i.e. English, Hindi and Sanskrit provided the candidate has studied the subjects at the graduation level.

## DURATION

The B Ed programme through regular mode shall be a minimum period of two academic years (spread across four semesters) and a maximum of three academic years from the date of admission of the candidate. There shall be at least 100 working days in each semester exclusive the period of examination and admission with 600 teaching clock hours (each working days having 6 teaching clock hours). The minimum attendance of students shall be 80% for Theory courses and practical and 90% for Field Attachments / School Internship / practice teaching.

## EVALUATION

The Evaluation system of the students has the following two components:

- 1) Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) accounting for the 20% of the total marks assigned to a particular course
- 2) End semester examination (ESE) accounting for the remaining 80% of the total marks assigned to particular course

## CONTINUOUS COMPREHENSIVE ASSESSMENT (CCA)

**Class Room Attendance** : Each student will have to attend a minimum of 80% of lectures / tutorials / practical's. Student having less than 80% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the end semester examinations (ESE).

However, the exemption from 80% attendance will be given to those participating in prescribed co curricular activities (e.g. NCC, NSS, Youth festivals, sports etc.) to the extent of 20% (making the necessary attendance as 60% in these cases) The claim for this exemption should be supported by authenticated certificate from the concerned university college authorities. The students having attendance between 70% and 79% attendance will apply for exemption on a prescribed form accompanied by clear reason for absence to competent authority. The students getting the exemptions, except for those getting exemption for co-curricular activities will not be entitled for getting the CCA mark for classroom attendance as given below:

### Classroom Attendance incentive:

Those having greater than 80% attendance (for those participating in Co Curricular activities, 20% will be added to percent attendance) will be awarded CCA marks (in case of courses with a total of 100 marks)

> 80% but <83%	1 marks
> 84% but <87%	2 marks
> 88% but <91%	3 marks
> 92% but <95%	4 marks
> 96%	5 marks

The marks on the basis of attendance (in case of courses with a total of 50 marks) will be awarded as follows:

> 80% but <86%	1 marks

> 94%	3 marks

### **INTERNSHIP IN TEACHING / PRACTICE TEACHING**

1. The students are required to go through a school internship for five months (20 weeks) during two years in the schools under the supervision of a teacher educator of the institution concerned in which a particular student is studying.
2. The school internship of one month duration will be held in the second semester. The school internship (practice teaching) of four months duration will be held in the third semester. Final examination of teaching practice/ internship in teaching will take place in third semester after the completion of mandatory lessons i.e. 50 macro lessons in each of the teaching subject.
3. For final teaching practice, the candidates must prepare two lessons one related to each of the teaching subject.
4. The board of examiner will consist of three external examiners. For this the panel of examiners will be drawn by the Chairperson, Dept of Education and duly approved by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of the university. The board of examiners will comprise of expert in Science, Arts teaching subject.
5. Allotment of schools for teaching practice to the trainees of B.Ed./D.El.Ed. course will be done by Dy. Director of school Education (Secondary/Elementary)
6. Final teaching practice examination charges @ 500/- per student

### **ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA**

The minimum essential educational qualification for D EI Ed is senior secondary school certificate or intermediate or 10+2 or its equivalent examination with at least 50% marks.

### **MODE OF ADMISSION**

Entrance test is conducted by Himachal Pradesh Board of School Education Dharamshala to grant admission in the D EI Ed program tentatively in July/August 2024. After the evaluation process, offline counselling takes place in HPBOSE Dharamshala for allotment of desired college to the concerned student.

### **Duration & Working Days of D EI Ed Course**

The following conditions will also be applicable to the candidates of two years D EI Ed course/session 2025-27

1. 90% attendance would be necessary in the D EI Ed training course in each academic year.
2. 60% pass marks in D EI Ed annual exam in each 1st Year and 2nd Year respectively and 55% marks in case of SC/ST/OBC/PWD candidates in order to ensure quality teacher training.
3. Merit and seniority will be on the basis of the marks secured in the D EI Ed pass course.
4. In case the trainees take leave on medical grounds/maternity purpose then the training will be extended by the duration of leave by the candidates.
5. During the training, the candidates would not pursue any other educational course/study either regular or through distance mode.

## **GENERAL GUIDELINES AND RULES FOR THE STUDENTS**

### **ADMISSION**

Every student seeking admission to a class must apply for admission on the prescribed proforma obtainable from college office/ download from the website of the college.

Admission is granted to only those students whose result of the qualifying examination is complete in all respects.

If at any time it is found that a student has made a false or incorrect declaration or has provided incorrect information, her candidature will be cancelled.

### **ATTENDANCE IN COLLEGE**

Biometric attendance system is installed in the college as per the guidance of Education Regulatory Commission (HP-PERC) in order to prevent proxy attendance and also to prevent unauthorized entries in the college campus. Students must mark their Biometric attendance during arrival and departure from the college campus.

### **RE-ADMISSION**

In case of continuous absence of 6 days without intimation the name of the student is struck off the rolls of the college. Further, the students have to apply for the re-admission after paying re-admission fee of Rs. 3000/-.

### **LIBRARY / IDENTITY CARD**

Every student is issued Identity and Library card at the time of admission. All the students are supposed to keep these cards with them during their entire stay in the college campus and to be shown on demand to the college/university officials during examination.

### **LEAVE RULES**

Student can proceed on leave with prior permission from college administration/Deptt concerned.

- Leave during house examination/class tests is sanctioned by the Head of the Department.
- Leave for sickness must be accompanied by the medical certificate.
- A tutor can recommend leave up to 2 days, for longer duration student must get application signed by Head of the Department.

- Special fine may be charged for breach of any of the college's rule and regulation.

## **FEE CONCESSION**

There is provision of some fee concession, stipends & scholarship to poor deserving/brilliant students. But such concessions are liable to be withdrawn in case of the students who:

- i) fail/remain absent in the House Examination
- ii) remain irregular in attendance.
- iii) found guilty of misbehavior.

At the time of admission, each student is to submit following documents along with the admission form within 10 days of admission.

- v. Gap year certificate ( if applicable)

- vii. Bonafide certificate
- viii. Character Certificate

## ELIGIBILITY FOR UNIVERSITY (ANNUAL/SEMESTER) EXAMINATION

- i) The candidate has attended not less than 75% lectures of the full course.
- ii) The student has obtained 25% marks in House Examination in all subjects/papers of relevant course.

## INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

Internal Assessment is carried out by observing students progress in:

- i) Class Tests
- ii) House Examination
- iii) Attendance
- iv) Assignments/Project/Seminar/Presentation etc.

## SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarship committee constituted in the college guides and informs the student about various Government/College Schemes for availing scholarships.

### College Scholarship Schemes:

- Sarla Devi Sood scholarship, Sarla Devi Charitable Trust Jalandhar, awards scholarships on the total Value of Rs 2500/-to the deserving students of merit cum means basis.
- Sh Baldev Singh Thakur (Founder Principal) KLB Memorial scholarship grants monetary help to two students every year, one from BA and other from B COM department. This scholarship bears full fee and dress expenses along with examination fee of HPU of two students in every academic session.

- The National Scholarship Portal (NSP) an initiative by the Govt. of India provides financial assistance to meritorious and under privileged students, helping them pursue higher Education without financial barriers.

Our institution is registered on the National Scholarship Portal (NSP), a Digital Plat form initiated by the Ministry of Education, Government of India. Eligible students can apply for various Central & State Government Scholarship including Post Matric Scholarship for SC/ST/OBC and EWS students. The Himachal Pradesh Labour Welfare Board (Kamgar Kalyan Board) provides scholarship to the children of registered workers and labourers. This scholarship amount may range from Rs. 1000/- to Rs. 25000 or more depending on the course level.

**EDUCATIONAL TOURS** : Educational Tours/Exposure visits are organised in every academic session to enhance learning and to encourage students to gain practical skills and knowledge.

**COLLEGE MAGAZINE** : In order to give expression to the creative urge of the student, the college publishes an annual magazine titled 'KUNJ VATIKA'. Student Editorial board is constituted through selection process. Student Editors are guided by the Staff Editorial Board.

**PRIZES** : Provision has been made for awarding prizes and certificates for distinctions in academics and other co-curricular activities.

**GYM** : Martial arts / Gym facility is introduced in the campus to promote physical fitness which is significant for overall development. Student can hit the Gym or attend Martial Arts training classes during free hours. These activities also help to check the screen time of students. Martial arts / Gym trainer is available in the college to guide students / staff.

**CANTEEN** : The college is providing canteen facility to the students as well as teaching and non teaching staff of the institute, inside the campus.

## **ABIG “NO” TO RAGGING**
