INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

The college has adequate infrastructure designed to have all facilities necessary for a healthy and conducive environment. It is located centrally in placid environment of Palampur. The institution is spread over 60 kanals of land donated by Gauri Mal Sood Trust, Shimla. The college has 4 main blocks i.e. Ratni block, Gauri block, Styawati block and Harikrishan block. It has large and airy classrooms equipped with modern furnishings. Apart from this the college has Director's office, Admin office, Hostel, Staff Residences, HOD's Offices, NSS/NCC Office, Staff Rooms, Girls Common Room, Medical Room, Exam Control Room, Music Room, Computer Labs including CBT Lab to facilitate online examination and Smart Classrooms, Laboratories for various disciplines, Art & Craft room, Centralized Library, Resource centres, Multi- purpose Hall, Seminar Hall, Conference Hall, spacious parking, Canteen and Pantry for staff, Gymnasium and Washrooms. Lift facility in Ratni block and ramp for Divyang students are available in the campus. To ensure surveillance and security across all blocks, CCTV cameras have been installed throughout the campus. A solar panel of 25 KW capacity has also been installed in the college. The college has implemented an efficient Rain Water Harvesting System on campus to promote sustainable water management and environment conservation. To keep pace with the changing times, the college keeps strengthening its ICT facilities for better teaching-learning process as well as administration.

HOSTEL FACILITY

The college provides a well-maintained, spacious and comfortable double-storey hostel facility for students. The hostel has spacious and well-ventilated rooms equipped with adequate furniture and other essential amenities to ensure a safe and comfortable stay. At present, around 31 students are residing in the hostel with facilities including a mess, common areas and other basic amenities required for their day-to-day needs. It also has a well-equipped gymnasium to promote physical fitness and overall well-being of the students.

The hostel provides a safe, secure, disciplined and conducive residential environment that enables students to maintain a healthy balance between their academic and personal lives. Proper cleanliness, hygiene and discipline are maintained within the hostel premises. A warden also resides in the hostel ensuring regular supervision, safety, guidance and support to the resident students.

The hostel facility is particularly beneficial for outstation students, enabling to pursue their studies conveniently while enjoying a comfortable, supportive and homely residential environment.

SPORTS GROUND/GYMNASIUM

The college has various sports facilities for Indoor and Outdoor games. The college actively participated in and organized several sports events during the academic session 2025-26.

- Ten students represented the college in the Satya Sai Run marathon held at Palampur on 26th October, 2025.
- Six girls from the U.G department participated in the Senior State Volleyball championship conducted at Baddi, Solan from 14th to 16th November, 2025 and represented Kangra District.
- College volleyball team also took part in the H.P University Inter-college (w) volleyball championship held at SCVB Govt. College Palampur from 19th to 21st November, 2025.
- Two girls from U.G department were selected for volleyball National camp held at Kullu from 3rd to 13th march, 2026.
- Annual Athletic meet was conducted on 14th to 15th march, 2026.

Fitness centre of the college has the capacity of 20 students in which both teachers as well as students practise Yoga and physical exercises for their physical and mental wellbeing. An expert martial art (female) trainer is deputed for girls student in this college.

LIBRARY Y FACILITIES AND SERVICES

The college library provides a wide range of facilities and academic resources to support the teaching and learning needs of students and faculty members. During the academic session, the library continued to facilitate access to print as well as digital learning resources.

- **DELNET (Developing Library Network):** The library provides access to DELNET resources, enabling students and faculty members to access a wide range of academic and research materials.
- **Access to E-Books and E-Journals:** Students and faculty members can access a large collection of e-books, e-journals, research papers and other scholarly resources available online.
- **Document Delivery Service:** The library facilitates access to copies of journal articles, research papers and other academic documents required by students and faculty members.
- **Access to Union Catalogue:** Students can search the union catalogues of libraries across India and identify books, journals, theses and dissertations available in different libraries.
- **Research Support:** The library supports students and faculty members in their research and project work by providing access to quality academic resources, research papers, theses and dissertations.
- **Discovery and Knowledge Portals:** The library provides access to digital discovery and knowledge platforms that enable users to search and access e-books, articles, e-resources and other educational materials through a single interface.

These library facilities contribute significantly to enhancing the academic environment of the college and promote self-learning, research, knowledge enhancement and the effective use of digital resources among students and faculty members.

COLLEGE COMMITTEES

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the college continuously works towards enhancing and sustaining quality in academic and administrative processes. It monitors teaching-learning practices, encourages research and innovation, facilitates faculty development, promotes student participation and ensures effective implementation of institutional policies.

BOARD OF STUDIES

The Board of Studies is a key academic body of the college responsible for planning and recommending value-added courses and academic programs running in the institution. It ensures that the teaching-learning process is effective, innovative, and in line with the overall vision and mission of the institution.

ACADEMIC COUNCIL

The Academic Council of the college serves as the Principal academic body of the institution and is entrusted with the responsibility of maintaining the highest standards in education. All decisions are taken in alignment with the guidelines of statutory bodies such as UGC, AICTE, NAAC and HPU to ensure compliance and quality assurance.

RESEARCH ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Research Advisory Committee facilitates collaborations with research organizations and has initiated various important MoUs with reputed institutions. It motivates faculty members to participate in seminars, publish research papers in reputed journals and conferences, and engage in academic discussions that enhance the research culture of the college.

SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE

The Scholarship Committee is committed to promoting inclusive education by extending financial assistance to deserving and meritorious students. During the academic session 2025-2026, the approximate amount of more than 41 lakhs was awarded through the National Scholarship Portal. Out of 350 Applicants, 323 students successfully availed scholarships under various government schemes.

In addition, a scholarship test was conducted by the college and financial aid worth Rs.25, 500/- was distributed to eligible students based on their performance. To further support economically weaker students, fee concessions amounting to approximately Rs.2.5 lakhs were granted. Through these initiatives, the committee ensures that financial constraints do not become a barrier to student's academic growth.

ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

The institution continues to maintain a safe and harmonious environment for students, strictly adhering to the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India regarding the prevention of ragging. An Anti-Ragging Committee has been constituted comprising senior faculty members. The committee ensures that the campus remains free from any incidents of ragging by regularly monitoring the situation, collecting feedback from students, and analyzing reports. Anti-ragging notifications are prominently displayed at various locations on campus. No incidents of ragging were reported during the academic year.

GRIEVANCE REREDRESSAL CELL

To ensure transparency and fairness, the college operates a Grievance Redressal Cell with the primary objective of preventing unfair practices and providing a platform for students to seek redressal for their grievance. The cell actively looks into complaints lodged by students and monitors their resolution status. It is also empowered to investigate matters related to harassment. During the academic year, no grievances or harassment cases were reported.

WOMEN CELL

A women cell has been constituted in the college to uphold the dignity of women as per the directives of Honorable Supreme Court of India. The cell works to promote gender equality, raise awareness about women's rights. During the academic year, the women cell organized various activities, including sessions on gender sensitization, women's health and self-defense programs, Expert talks on legal rights, mental health etc.

GUIDANCE AND PLACEMENT CELL

With the introduction of professional courses like BCA, BBA, MCA, B.Ed. and D.El.Ed realizing the needs of fast changing world and the opportunities thus created for the students, the college has set up a career placement cell. The cell primarily aims at obtaining the best possible placement for the final year students. With the sincere efforts, 100% placement assistance has been provided to students, resulting in recruitment of BBA, BCA and MCA students in reputed companies like Wipro, Tech Mahindra, InfoTech, Siblicode, Excellence Technology, ICICI Prudential, HDFC, Infosys etc. and reputed education institutions.

DISASTER MANAGEMENT CELL

The college has constituted a Disaster Management Cell with the objective of creating awareness, preparedness and effective response mechanism in case of any natural or man-made disaster. The cell is responsible for framing the disaster management plan of the institution, conducting mock drills, and training students and staff on safety measures and evacuation procedures. During the academic year, awareness sessions and demonstrations on fire safety, first aid, and emergency evacuation were organized. The cell also ensured that all safety equipment, including fire extinguishers, were checked and kept in working condition.

GREEN AUDIT COMMITTEE

The Green Audit Committee is formed in the college to promote environmental awareness and ensure eco-friendly practice on campus. The committee regularly monitors and evaluates the institution's environmental practices, including energy usage, waste management, water conservation, and plantation activities. During the academic year, the committee undertook the various initiatives like organized tree plantation drives and campus cleanliness campaigns to enhance greenery and maintain hygiene, promoted plastic-free and energy-saving practices among students and staff through awareness programs, Encourage rainwater harvesting and proper waste segregation as part of sustainable campus initiatives.
